(1) Good Sam Seeks Allies for Circles Program: Are you interested in doing something that will make a real difference, both for yourself and someone else? Good Samaritan Ministries' Circles program is based on transformational friendships that cross social boundaries and create space for individuals to pursue their goals. Circles matches program participants who are walking the path from surviving to thriving (called Leaders), with encouraging community members (called Allies). Each pair—one Leader and one Ally—meets weekly for 18 months for about two hours per week. (Because of social distancing guidelines, Circles currently uses a hybrid virtual/in-person model.) Good Sam needs 20 new Allies to begin training by February 2021 so that we can start a new Circles class.
