Showcases the history of the Michigan town of Idlewild "from its vibrant eras of bustling tourism to its remarkable journey of revival and rejuvenation. Founded in 1912 as a haven for African Americans, Idlewild provided respite, leisure, recreation, and community that drew in middle-class professionals from the Midwest for decades." Co-curated with DEI consultant Chris (C. J.) Kingdom Grier, who was born and raised in Idlewild and is the current Yates Township/Idlewild historian and archivist.
