As taken from an MDE press release:

Several Michigan school districts, their students, and their communities will benefit from the state allocating funding to eliminate outstanding debt, the Michigan Department of Education said today. With the passage of a state budget supplemental bill by the Michigan Legislature and Governor Gretchen Whitmer signing the supplemental into law today, local school districts in Pontiac, Benton Harbor, Muskegon Heights, and Ypsilanti will be able to pay off their financial debts.

While this does not directly impact Holland, it shows a realization from the state that schools have been underfunded as stated by State Board President Dr. Pamela Pugh. "The state has the responsibility to better fund its school districts—all its districts, and particularly those whose children need more from schools and often receive less."

West Michigan Teacher Collaborative

The state's investment in the development of teachers is starting to pay off. Holland has multiple employees who have been accepted into the West Michigan Teacher Collaborative. Several of these have diverse backgrounds and hard-to-find skill sets that will greatly benefit Holland when they complete the program.

West Coast Chamber Leadership Cohort

Last week I had the opportunity to take part in my monthly leadership cohort with the West Coast Chamber of Commerce. It was Health and Human Services day so we visited several of the different organizations in Holland that serve the diverse needs of our community. We visited the Community Action House, Holland Hospital and their Behavioral Health wing, the Rescue Mission, and the Child Advocacy Center. It was a great reminder of how fortunate we are to be in a community that supports its most vulnerable members and it was reassuring in our belief that Holland Public Schools is the center of a thriving city, and it is our responsibility to unite the community around the success of ALL students.
