

## Project: Presentation: The Middle Age's Effect on Humanism

6. a slide/bubble comparing and contrasting literature from the Middle Ages to that from the Renaissance
7. a slide/bubble in which you take a stand as to whether Humanism builds upon the ideas of the Middle Ages or breaks away from them
