Every generation of teenagers has had their own way of expressing themselves. Today it is tats, rings in various locations, and other idiosyncrasies. The kids who grew up in the '50s and '60s had theirs as well. The 1950s saw greasy hair and the advent of rock and roll. The next decade saw teens with long hair, dingy clothes, and a drug culture.

The changes teenagers were undergoing during these two decades were a reflection of what was happening in America. An era of peace following the Korean War was undermined by heated exchanges in the Cold War. One of the most popular presidents in American history was gunned down. Following his death, the country became embroiled in another war in Asia. Even as all of this was going on, a protracted series of demonstrations took place demanding racial integration and other civil rights. As turbulent as this era was, a lot of good came out of it.

This unit covers the tenures of three presidents: Eisenhower, Kennedy, and Johnson. Each one impacted the country in his own way. Many of the decisions made during this time are still affecting us today.

Chapter 1 - The 1950s

In this chapter, you will learn about the Eisenhower years and how the Cold War between America and Russia heated up. You will see how this ideological conflict reached the stars even as Europe was caught in the middle. It is also about vast changes society experienced with regard to the youth culture and civil rights. Some of the technological changes, such as television, were going to have a direct impact on the '60s.

Chapter 2 - The Winds of Change

In retrospect, the turbulence of the '60s was foretold during Kennedy's presidency. The Cold War became so heated that America and Russia very nearly went to war during the Cuban Missile Crisis. Just one year later, President Kennedy was assassinated, leaving behind a wife and two young children. At the same time, American forces were helping South Vietnam deal with Communist threats.

At home, the civil rights movement exploded on the scene during President Johnson's administration with the passage of two signature civil rights acts. The birthing of this movement saw long-needed changes under the leadership of Martin Luther King and

others. The civil rights movement also provided the drive for other movements to take shape, altering the social landscape of America forever.

Chapter 3 - Setbacks and Advances

Chapter three introduces you to the Vietnam era. Under the direction of Lyndon Johnson, the United States stepped up its influence in Vietnam, signaling the beginning of some bloody years marked with increased demonstrations, riots, and much discord at home. His administration achieved great societal changes, which at times were overshadowed by the continuing conflict.
