GLOSSARY AND CREDITS

The '60s were characterized by waves of unrest, uncertainty, and relentless demands made on the Federal government. The civil rights movement dominated the domestic scene for much of the decade, culminating in positive achievements (the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Voting Rights Act of 1965) and negative actions (race riots and violence). The Vietnam War was etched across the screens of American televisions, helping to give rise to the anti-war movement that reached its apex during the latter part of the decade. The nation also experienced the loss of three popular leaders, John Kennedy, Martin Luther King, and Bobby Kennedy, to assassins' bullets.

Chapter 1 - A Montage of Unrest

The first part of the decade saw a heating-up and then cooling-down of the Cold War as incidents between the United States and Soviet Union brought the earth to the brink of world war. At the same time, the civil rights movement was growing by leaps and bounds, finally achieving two major breakthroughs in the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Voting Rights Act of 1965. President Kennedy was assassinated in 1963. His successor, President Johnson, greatly escalated the Vietnam War, sending thousands of troops to fight in the jungles. The move was very unpopular and gave rise to almost constant protests around the nation's campuses.

Chapter 2 - Cultural Mosaic

Even in the midst of so much chaos, America saw achievements made in technology, the arts, and entertainment. Rock music reached a classical stage with the arrival of the British invasion and countercultural artists. Terrific strides were made in medicine with the first heart transplants and several new wonder drugs. Some of America's most beloved authors appeared during the '60s, producing many classic works of literature.

Chapter 3 - 1968

The year 1968 was not a very good year. The January Tet Offensive gave Americans notice that the Vietnam War was not going as well as reported. First, Martin Luther King and then Bobby Kennedy lost their lives to assassins. The anti-war movement was peaking, with violent protests that were televised live during the Democratic National Convention, making the convention a bitter source of embarrassment to the city of

Chicago. In the midst of the turmoil, NASA was on the brink of landing a man on the moon, thus fulfilling a promise President Kennedy had made a few years earlier.
