Your study of American History has gotten you to events that occurred during your lifetime. This unit focuses on the presidencies of Bill Clinton, George W. Bush, and Barack Obama. Each of them has had to deal with complex domestic and foreign policy issues.

International incidents have been numerous, with some sparking worldwide outrage like North Korea's testing of a nuclear weapon. The last eight years have seen Americans fighting two wars while citizens at home have been struggling economically with job losses, rising prices, and numerous other financial issues.

Chapter 1 – The Clinton Years

The Clinton presidency was filled with a number of major scandals, one of which nearly got him impeached. Unfortunately, these scandals detracted from better-than-average decisions he made on both domestic policy and foreign matters. Under his administration, the economy performed nicely. International issues were complicated as conflict erupted on nearly every continent.

The scandals Bill Clinton faced involved business and personal dealings. Committing perjury caused Congress to nearly impeach him toward the end of his term in office.

Chapter 2 – A World Event in America

Every president knows important decisions await once the oath of office is taken. But, no one could have been prepared for September 11, 2001. The terrorist attacks on American soil brought a declaration of war on terrorism by President George W. Bush. The Department of Homeland Security was begun as the United Nations authorized force against Afghanistan's Taliban government for harboring Osama bin Laden, one of the architects of 9/11. Two years later, in 2003, the United States and coalition forces invaded Iraq and deposed Saddam Hussein, who was later captured.

President Barack Obama oversaw the withdrawal of American combat troops from Iraq in August of 2010. The war in Afghanistan continued as the Taliban launched attacks on U.S. and coalition forces. The war has also heavily involved neighboring Pakistan as Taliban forces have used that nation as a staging area for attacks in Afghanistan. The United States increased pressure on Pakistan to go after the Taliban and other terrorist leaders who were hiding within its borders. American concerns about Pakistan's ability

to root out terrorist leaders intensified in 2011 when the world learned that Osama bin Laden had been hiding in a city less than 40 miles north of the nation's capital.

Chapter 3 – Uncertainty and Hope

President Obama had to deal with a crashing economy as the home mortgage crisis, spiking oil prices, and high unemployment pushed America into a deep recession. The Federal government provided a nearly 800 billion-dollar stimulus package designed to get Americans back on their feet.

Overseas, Iran and North Korea have earned the anger of the international community with several missile tests and the testing of nuclear weapons.
